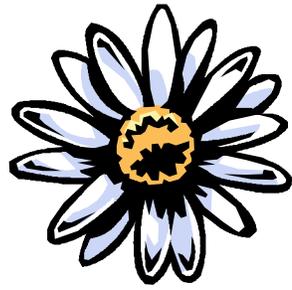


# Book Nook
