

Your GRΣΣK Dictionary

Do you still remember how we learned some Greek together? Well, it's time to add a couple more words to your Greek dictionary. So here they are:

λογος means "word" in English, that is "something said." This word comes from the word **λεγω**, which means to "lay forth" or to "express." **λογος** therefore, means "an expression of God." God is through His Word, through His **λογος** expressing Himself.

εκβαλλω is a word that is actually put together from two words: **εκ** meaning "out of" and **βαλλω** meaning to "throw." When we put these together, we find out that **εκβαλλω** means to "throw out of," thus signifying power or force. Jesus **εκβαλλω** the devil out of the dumb man in Matthew 9:33 and he spoke. Jesus also **εκβαλλω** all them that sold and bought in the temple as written in Matthew 21:12. He didn't tell them, "Oh, please, would you be so kind and leave this place?" but He cast them out with force. The same word is used when Jesus tells the disciples, *Pray ye therefore the Lord of the harvest, that he will send forth labourers into his harvest* (Matthew 9:38). He didn't mean, "Please would you go?" but **εκβαλλω** them with power. Are you going to allow Him to **εκβαλλω** you into His harvest?
